

PROTECT HOMELESS PEOPLE'S CIVIL LIBERTIES - OPPOSE SB 1045

The Board of Supervisors' Rules Committee will vote on whether or not to implement state Senate Bill 1045 in San Francisco. Join us to urge Supervisors Ronen, Mar, and Walton to vote "NO" on the implementation of SB 1045 in San Francisco!



SB 1045 would create a new form of conservatorship, which moves us away from the longstanding practice of only placing people in locked facilities when they present a harm to self and others, and instead use 8 "5150" police detentions as the criteria. This is a new legal process through which an individual can lose the right to make decisions about their housing, finances, and medical care. The bill targets homeless people with severe mental illness and substance addiction. While claiming to be a solution to chronic homelessness, this bill provides no funding for housing or mental health treatment. For more information, visit http://bit.ly/SDA_SB1045.
